No commercial contract may be concluded with third party participants in the test. Furthermore, the licence holder will provide all third party participants with the relevant information in advance.

At the Institute's request, the licence holder undertakes to provide test results in the form of reports, as well as technical parameters as required.

The licensee is obliged to inform the Institute at least 7 days before the commissioning of each transmitting station, notwithstanding any other authorisations required.

The radio equipment included in the experimental licence must not cause harmful interference to other radio services and must not claim protection against harmful interference caused by radio stations of another service in the same frequency band(s).

The licence holder must ensure that the radio services in the frequency bands used for the trial series comply with the [National Frequency Plan](#). Furthermore, in the event that the holder of a trial licence subsequently applies for a definitive licence, such a licence may be granted in a frequency band other than that initially planned for the trial project.

The licence holder must respect the radio field limits as defined in the agreements in force with neighbouring countries in the border region. In the event of harmful interference caused by the equipment in this test, the test licence holder must immediately put an end to this interference.
